The centerpiece of our community engagement program, MoveMEANT programs MoveMEANT are collaborative and unique experiences designed for 3 purposes:

1. to facilitate community dialogues around social justice and cultural values

2. to explore important ideas by creating authentic moveMEANT narratives that originate from the self

**3.** to create powerful moveMEANT purpose and momentum for social change

No dance experience necessary and all abilities are welcome. Custom experiences can be created to address community needs and objectives.

Rooted in the belief that dance is a powerful tool for resilience and progress, MoveMEANT programs are facilitated as movement / dance workshops, panel discussions, and travel programs.

### Edible Tales: Ho'okupu Edible Tales: Food Tours Hawai'i & NYC (year-round)

The community-centered program continues with 6 monthly hands-on aloha 'āina (land stewardship) & Hawaiian cultural learning events on Oahu, and 3 Food tours and a performance at Brooklyn Grange in NYC.


Began in the pandemic as a Zoom session to stay connected, Edible Tales has evolved into a food movement that explores cultural heritage, social justice and environmental sustainablity with the community.



#### AAPINH Spring Community Week NYC May 2023

The Spring Community Week in NYC celebrates AAPINH culture and identity, as well as our community at large. The week includes a Land Acknowledgement Ceremony, Fundraiser Workshops for a NYC-Based nonprofit organization, and a performance. In 2023 we hosted a day of fundraiser classes for Red Hawk Native American Council, and co-created an original repertoire, Hula Kiʻi workshops with Uncle Calvin Hoe, Ola Ka Huakaʻihele O Hiʻiaka (Becoming Hiʻiaka) with Kauila Kanakaʻole in celebration of Kumu Edith Kanakaʻoleʻs US Quarter release.





## Summer Social Justice Intensive: What Are You Rooted In?

#### August 2023, NYC & Hybrid

Launched in Summer 2019 in NYC, and expanded online in 2020 as a response to the George Floyd murder and protests against police brutality, our Summer Social Justice Intensive will be held in-person and on Zoom. The weeklong intensive features daily anti-racist training, group healing sessions and a creative lab that holds space for participants to explore using their artistic voices to create authentic moveMEANT stories. In 2023 we collaborated with The Pōpolo Project (Hawai`i), Ladies of Hip Hop (NY) and Brooklyn Grange (NY) for a week of anti-racist training and creative exploration. Original work-in-progress by the participants will be shared at the Black August event at Brooklyn Grange.





## Fall 2023 Season

#### NYC NOV 18th-19th

The fall performance season brings together our Hawai`i and NYC company members for the world premier of our complete Edible Tales production - an immersive dance and cultural experience that is the culmination of 3 years of community dialogues, movement exploration and cultural re-connection. In Hawai`i the performance is October 28th at KEY Project, with a Ho`olaule a (celebration) showcasing our nonprofit collaborators and partners throughout the year.

In NYC, the performances are November 16th-18th for 3 nights, with a special gala featuring the Edible Tales documentary film premiere on November 18th. The gala celebrates our 14th anniversary as a company. Location: Peridance Center

#### Hawai`i Nov 11th at KEY Project

The Fall Hawai`i 2023 season features our 2nd Ho`olaule`a and the Edible Tales: Ho`okupu Hō`ike featuring works from our Hawai`i Company Members and workshop participants. The Ho`olaule`a also Hawaiian food, interactive activities, and a Nonprofit Sharing Circle to inspire resource-sharing and collaboration.


